2000

Sussex Academy originated as Sussex Academy of Arts and Sciences as a middle school serving grades 6-8.

2012

A major charter modification was approved by the Delaware Department of Education to add a high school serving grades 9-12.

2013

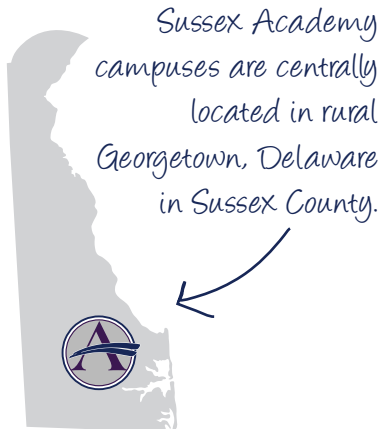
The school name was changed to Sussex Academy and grade 9 was enrolled.

2017

A high school grade was added each year until the 2016-2017 school year when Sussex Academy had its first graduating class.

2020

A major charter modification was approved by the Delaware Department of Education to add an elementary school serving grades K-5.



Overview

- There are 1123 students in grades K-12
- May 2022 Sussex Academy was ranked the 4th high school in Delaware by the US News and World Report on National High School Rankings
- Applications are accepted online (schoolchoicede.org/Apply/SussexAcademy) from November-January
- Admission for grades K-11 is through a lottery held in January each year
- There is a yearly activity fee that covers technology, clubs, yearbooks and more
- Sussex Academy students are required to wear school uniforms

Exploratories

All K-5 students will participate in various exploratories throughout the school year which include physical education, health, visual arts, performing arts, and Spanish.

Community Service

Elementary students will be exposed to whole school community service projects throughout the year.

Environmental Science

Environmental education at SAES is taught to students in kindergarten through 5th-grade. The class is once a week throughout the year. Environment-based education involves students in a rigorous approach to learning while developing love and respect for nature through outdoor experiences.

Clubs

The elementary students participate in a variety of after school clubs and activities.

World Language

Students in grades 6-7 will be participating in a Spanish exploratory. An opportunity to take a full year of Spanish will be offered in 8th grade.

Athletics

Middle School Boys: Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Lacrosse, and Soccer

Middle School Girls: Basketball, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Soccer, Softball, and Volleyball

Clubs/Extra Curricular Activities

Sussex Academy middle school students participate in clubs during school year. Band and theatre are offered after school. Middle school students also participate in school dances, field trips and “reward” events. Students in 8th grade learn etiquette and take dance lessons to prepare for an end of year formal luncheon.

SUSSEX ACADEMY HIGH SCHOOL

World Language

Spanish and French are offered for each high school grade. AP Spanish will be offered starting in the 22-23 school year. The DE State graduation requirement is that all high school students take two years of the same language.

Senior Service Project

In 9th grade students begin work on a four-year research and service project. Students currently enrolled in the International Baccalaureate Program will complete a CAS (Community, Activity, Service) Project.

Athletics

High School Boys: Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Golf, Indoor Track & Field, Lacrosse, Soccer, Spring Track & Field, Swimming, Tennis, Volleyball, and Wrestling

High School Girls: Basketball, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Golf, Indoor Track & Field, Lacrosse, Soccer, Softball, Spring Track & Field, Swimming, Tennis, and Volleyball

Clubs/Extra Curricular Activities

Club participation is available to high school students. Some clubs meet during the school day while others require time outside of the scheduled school day. Field trips, dances, homecoming, prom, band, and theatre are also available.
