2012

A major charter modification was approved by the Delaware Department of Education to add a high school serving grades 9-12.

2013

The school name was changed to Sussex Academy and grade 9 was enrolled.

2017

A high school grade was added each year until the 2016-2017 school year when Sussex Academy had its first graduating class.

2020

A major charter modification was approved by the Delaware Department of Education to add an elementary school serving grades K-5.

Sussex Academy campuses are centrally located in rural Georgetown, Delaware in Sussex County.

Exploratories

All K-5 students will participate in various exploratories throughout the school year which include physical education, health, visual arts, performing arts, and Spanish.

Community Service

Elementary students will be exposed to whole school community service projects throughout the year.

Environmental Science

Environmental education at SAES is taught to students in kindergarten through 5th-grade. The class is once a week throughout the year. Environment-based education involves students in a rigorous approach to learning while developing love and respect for nature through outdoor experiences.

Clubs

The elementary students participate in a variety of after school clubs and activities.

Exploratories

Students in grades 6-8 will participate in various exploratories throughout the school year to include Physical Education/Health, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Environmental Sciences and other STEM-related courses.

Advisory

Students in grades 6-8 will engage in a daily Advisory period. Advisory is dedicated to support students in their rigorous academic work. Students can spend time re-taking an assessment, receive additional support from a teacher in a content area in which they need additional support, or meet with the school counselor

Athletics

Middle School Boys: Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Lacrosse, and Soccer

Middle School Girls: Basketball, Cross Country, Field Hockey, Soccer, Softball, and Volleyball

Clubs/Extra Curricular Activities

Sussex Academy middle school students participate in clubs during school year. Band and theatre are offered after school. Middle school students also participate in school dances, field trips and "reward" events. Students in 8th grade learn etiquette and take dance lessons to prepare for an end of year formal luncheon.

SUSSEX ACADEMY HIGH SCHOOL

World Language

Spanish is offered for each high school grade, including AP Spanish. The DE State graduation requirement is that all high school students take two years of the same language.

Senior Service Project

In 9th grade students begin work on a four-year research and service project.

Clubs/Extra Curricular Activities

Club participation is available to high school students. Some clubs meet on Friday's, during our advisory time. Some clubs are dedicated to after-school time. Field trips, dances, homecoming, prom, band and theatre are also available.

Advisory

Students in grades 9-12 will engage in a daily Advisory period. Monday's are dedicated to school-wide messages. Tuesday - Thursday, students can get signed out to re-take an assessment, receive additional support from a teacher or meet with a school counselor/advisor.

DUAL ENROLLMENT AND ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

Sussex Academy offers 16 different Advanced Placement Courses and has Dual Enrollment partnerships with the University of Delaware and Delaware Technical & Community College.
